Listed below are the main types of bullying:

Racist: racist comments and direct taunts, graffiti, gestures.

Sexual: unwanted physical contact, abusive comments.

- Listening to all the children involved
- Investigating all reported incidents
- Making children aware of the consequences of their actions
- Informing key people
- Removing privileges

Advice for parents

Watch for signs of distress in your child, loss of confidence or not wanting to go to school.
