Listed below are the main
types of bullying:

Verbal: name calling, persistent
teasing, spreading rumours,
sarcasm

Physical: pushing, kicking,
hitting, pinching, any form of
violence or threats.

Emotional: tormenting, mocking,
funny looks, stares, making others
feel excluded from groups.

Racist: racist comments and
direct taunts, graffiti, gestures.

Sexual: unwanted physical contact,
abusive comments.

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If bullying were to take place, it would be dealt with in the following ways:

- Listening to all the children involved
- Investigating all reported incidents
- Making children aware of the consequences of their actions
- Informing key people
- Removing privileges
- Children to apologise for their behaviour
- Setting up programmes to improve behaviour



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Advice for parents

Watch for signs of distress in your child, loss of confidence or not wanting to go to school.

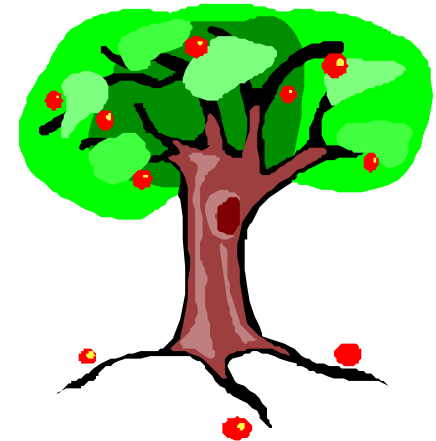
Inform the school if you think your child is being bullied.

Talk to your child and tell them to speak to an adult at school. Make sure that your child knows there is nothing wrong with them, that they are not to blame if they are being bullied.

Do not encourage them to hit back. Do not agree to keep the bullying secret. Take bullying seriously.

Help to build up your child's confidence.
